For item 18, last year San Diego Miramar College reported Aviation Technology as one of the programs in which students must pass a licensure exam in order to work in the field. However, upon clarification, many students in this program of study are able to work in the field without FAA mechanical licenses. In fact, most students don't take their first jobs as full maintenance technicians.

For item 22, Student Services and Learning Support, the total number of student services with activities has increased by three which are in the first cycle of assessment:

1) Veterans Affairs at last reporting was included with Admissions. The function still reports to Admission, but will assess its outcomes separately.

2) Mental Health at last reporting was included with the Counseling Department, which is no longer the case. While the College coupled it with Health Services, the work is very different so those outcomes will be assessed separately.

3) The Dean of Matriculation and Student Development administrative unit is in its first cycle of evaluation.
