Special Note: Students should choose the best plan to earn their Firefighter I Certification which is a requirement of the degree. Students may attend the Regional Fire Academy at Heartland Fire Training offered in Spring of each year (FIPT 381F and FIPT 381G) OR attend the San Diego Fire Academy (If hired or selected as an Open Enrollee through the lottery process) or attend the 10 Modules (Classes) FIPT 150A, 150B, 150C, 106, 110A, 322B, 322C, 323B, 324A and 381G (Skills Review and Certification course). Courses are offered every 8 weeks and students may begin at any time during an 8-week cycle.
